TRANSDERMAL PATCHES...TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT....

The Institute For Safe Medication Practices (ISMP) has received reports of two incidents in which Nicotine Transdermal Patches were dispensed to patients instead of Nitroglycerin Patches. The patches were stored alphabetically by generic name in the pharmacy where medications were pulled manually by technicians (not dispensed by an automatic robot).

Due to their alphabetical proximity, the Nicotine and Nitroglycerin patches wound up side by side. To compound the problem, the medications come in similar looking packages. The pharmacy involved in these errors has changed and re-labeled the shelving locations of these products, and made staff aware of the newly located stock.

Providing Nicotine in place of Nitroglycerin (or vice versa) is likely to cause serious adverse reactions. For this reason, Nicotine patches have been removed from clinical areas in some facilities.

Grief at Work

A friend of mine died suddenly this summer while he was on vacation. George was well-liked by his fellow employees who were shocked at his passing. The people he worked with are having a hard time adjusting to life in the office without George. They are over their initial shock but they miss him and not sure of what to do about their grief. You may know the feeling if you had a friend at work who died suddenly.

The **CareNotes** *When Death Comes Unexpectedly* suggests that bereaved should not be afraid of their feelings, bring closure to unfinished business, find support through sharing, have patience, set new routines and use the power of prayer.

I did a little research and found a great little book about grief in the workplace.

In **Healing Grief at Work**, Dr. Alan Wolfelt, a noted grief counselor, provides 100 practical ideas for dealing with grief in the workplace. It is a thought provoking, but simple book with one idea per page.

The book ends with a Mourner's Code of Ten Self-Compassionate Principles. One example is "You have the right to have grief-bursts". It may not be in the library but is available from Amazon.com.
